2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time



Before our little break during the Christmas Season, we ended our reflections on the Liturgy of the Word. The second part of the Holy Mass is the Liturgy of the Eucharist. For those who are keeping track, this is the point in the story of Emmaus when the disciples ask Jesus to stay with them. "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." (Luke 24:29) This echoes the disciples request of Jesus in St. John's gospel. "Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him 'Rabbi' (which translated means Teacher), 'where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come and you will see.'" (John 1:38-39) As the disciples were asking Jesus to stay with them, they were inviting Him into a greater relationship. There is more than the Liturgy of the Word, there is Christ's full presence in the Holy Eucharist. This is why attending Holy Mass is so important. We can watch the Holy Mass on TV, but we can not receive Him in the Blessed Sacrament. I can watch personalities on TV, but I do not have a relationship with them. It is only when I stay with them, go to their home, eat with them and share my gifts with them that I now can say I have a relationship. Thus, the echoes of the Little Drummer Boy rings through the Christmas Season into Ordinary Time. "Our finest gifts we bring to lay before the King." The Presentation of Gifts is symbolic and real. We bring bread, wine, and an offering

for the care of the ministry of the church. With these physical gifts, we also bring ourselves. Remember the idea of processions. We are moving to Jesus, the King, as a community. 


