Divine Mercy Sunday



Happy Easter! As we continue our Easter Celebration we come to today's special observance of God's Divine Mercy. This mercy is offered every day at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass as we commemorate the Sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. During the Stations of the Cross we proclaim, "For by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world." During the Divine Mercy Chaplet we proclaim, "For atonement of our sins and those of the whole world." This is why the message of the Cross can never be separated from God's Mercy. So this begs a question, how is suffering merciful? If one is suffering, they are lacking in something. If one suffers physically there is a physical deficiency. If one is suffering spiritually there is a spiritual deficiency. This lack cannot be overcome on our own without greater suffering. Also, if this lack is not addressed it can lead to death, the absence of life. It is through the Cross of Jesus that death is overcome along with suffering. The first thing one needs to realize is that there is a loss in one's life. This need recognizes the suffering one is going through. Once a person recognizes this suffering they are able to ask for help. This is where mercy enters the story. Through the Cross of Jesus, mercy overcomes suffering and Jesus unites His suffering to our own. "From

His fullness we have all received, grace in place of grace." (John 1:16) All we need to do is ask. It is through this grace in the reception of the Holy Eucharist and forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation that God's grace fills our suffering soul. We no longer lack anything because we are full of Divine Mercy. Suffering leads us to mercy for it was Christ's mercy that led Him to the Cross. How beautiful is God's Love! God's Peace! Fr. 
