



Happy Easter! As Jesus was made known to the disciples in the Breaking of the Bread. He is made known to us today. Just to recap our conversation concerning the Eucharistic Prayer. We now stand at the foot of the Cross, from the Gospels, and the Throne of the Lamb, from the Book of Revelation. However, it is important to understand the first three words of the previous statement, we **NOW** stand. Just as Jesus was made known to the disciples in Emmaus, He is **NOW** made known to us. This is why the phrase, "do this in memory of me" is not just a recalling of an event long ago. The Eucharist is truly a re-membering. We are re-membered to Jesus as the disciples were. We are re-membered to the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob because God is not a God of the dead but of the living. (Mark 12:27) The priest offers the bread and wine to become the Body and Blood of Jesus. The people offer themselves and their prayers silently to God the Father through the Son in the power of the Holy Spirit. The priest does offer the intention of the Holy Mass at this time, sometimes announcing aloud but mostly silently. This is also

why the priest and the people do not say the same thing. How awesome is that moment! This is why the Holy Mass is the source and summit of our prayer life as a Church. We offer our prayers with that of Jesus, through the priest, directly to God the Father! We pray for the living and the dead for we are all alive in Christ Jesus. (1 Cor 15:22) Christ then leads us to the great AMEN! God's Peace! Fr. Brian



After consultation with Parish Council, we are looking at discontinuing the streaming of the Holy Mass from Our Lady of Mount Carmel. The number of viewers average around 4 and the

time that the Holy Mass is viewed averages 15 minutes. The main focus of the Holy Mass, the Holy Eucharist, is missing being that viewership drops drastically after the Homily. Though this was an important ministry during the COVID crisis, the need for this ministry seems to be waning but also causing a crisis in people not receiving the Blessed Sacrament. The Conference of Catholic Bishops remind us that "the televised Mass is never a substitute for the Church's pastoral care for the sick in the form of visits by parish ministers who share the Scriptures and bring Communion, nor is it ever a substitute for the Sunday Mass celebrated within a parish faith community each week." We are looking at discontinuing this ministry by May 19th. However, please let us know your thoughts. If there is a real need, we will discuss at our next Parish Council Meeting. Please keep us in your prayers and know of our prayers for discernment.
