Hospital and Homebound: Please call the office for First Friday or Anointing.


Priesthood and Religious Life: Contact our priests for an appointment.

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



During the Presentation of the Gifts there are also several silent prayers being offered. When the wine is poured into the chalice, a small drop of water is added. "By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity." This prayer is prayed silently by the deacon or priest while the chalice is being prepared. The wine, the fruit of the vine and the work of human hands, and the water, the free will offering of God, is combined into one substance. The same way that the humanity and divinity of Christ, the hypostatic union, is always united. In the same way that our humanity is united to God's divine nature through the sacrament of baptism. Finally, this little drop of water is symbolic of God's grace. "Grace is favor, the free and undeserved help that God gives us to respond to His call to become children of God, adoptive sons, partakers of the divine nature and eternal life. Grace is participation in the life of God." (CCC 1996-1997) All this is united to the offering and presented to the Lord God of all creation. After the blessing of the bread and chalice the priest bows down low and silently prays, "With humble spirit and contrite heart may we be accepted by you, O Lord, and may our sacrifice in your sight this day be pleasing to you, Lord God." Remember that we are offering our very best, our very selves, to God through the Son in the power of the Holy Spirit. Through the hands of the priest this Divine and Human sacrifice is united to Christ on the cross. Again, in humility, the priest prays silently, "Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin." Though a practical practice in some areas and moments of the Church, this action puts aside anything that would impede the sacrifice being offered reverently and with great devotion. So beautiful is the love of God at the hands of the priest. God's Peace! Fr. Brian






Faith Formation Classes Sundays at 9:30 AM
