#### **Sacraments**

This is a great time to review a little of our conversation. Remember, before we even come to the church our preparation for Holy Mass begins by our prayer at home. We pray through the week with our hopes and joys, struggles and crosses, always uniting our life of prayer to our life lived in the world. We then gather our thoughts before we come to the Holy Mass to remember our week and our needs. We arrive at Holy Mass early in order to call these prayers to mind and place them before the Father. Then the community prays for these intentions during our Opening Prayer (Collect) as we are asked, "Let us pray." God then speaks to us through Salvation History

and the teachings of Jesus Christ in the Gospel and Homily. We then pray for the world and the world's needs. Then, AGAIN, we present to God our gifts and our very selves in the Presentation of the Gifts. The great part of this next presentation is that our intentions coming into the church might be different then the intention we bring to the altar. The intention might be answered,. It might be looked at differently. We might be different in the presentation of the intention. The intention might not be different but rather might be intensified in its need. However the intention might be, our intention and our very selves are presented to the Father through the sacrifice of the Son in the power of the Holy Spirit. This is the power of the Holy Mass. God listens to each and everyone of us and it is through His Grace we are transitioned, transformed, transubstantiated into being more God's child.


#### **World Marriage Day**




