Fifth Sunday in Lent



The Holy Mass is also rooted in the end of time with the Paschal Lamb of God. This is why, toward receiving the Eucharist, the priest announces, "Behold the Lamb of God." These words come from St. John the Baptist, "Behold the Lamb of God." (John 1:29) They also echo the words of Pilate at the judgement, "Behold the man." (John 19:5) These two "beholds" echo each other to point to Jesus as the Lamb of sacrifice and our salvation. This can be found in the Book of Revelation, "Salvation comes from our God, who is seated on the throne, and from the Lamb." (Rev. 7:10) We also read, "The Lamb who is in the center of the throne will shepherd them and lead them to springs of life-giving water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes." (Rev. 7:17) This language sounds familiar for the early Christians as well as our family today. "Life giving water" is from Jesus' conversation with the woman at the well. (John 4) "Good shepherd" is also coming from John's Gospel in the tenth chapter. All these connections point to the Holy Eucharist and this point of the Holy Mass where we unite all time from the Incarnation to the Second Coming

of Christ. So we kneel before the Altar of the Cross and the Throne of the Lamb. "As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bend before me, and every tongue will give praise to God. So then each of us shall give an account of himself to God." (Romans 14:11-12) This is why we kneel instead of stand, in humility and worship. However, there is also the posture of the heart as we come before the Lord. What is your posture of worship? God's Peace! Fr. Brian





Soup, Salad and Study for the Soul


