First Sunday in Lent



The church now stands as the priest invites them to share in the Sacrifice of the Altar. Remember what it means when we stand, we are moving. This procession is to Calvary. As we make this sacrifice we unite ourselves, priest and congregation, to Jesus on His way to Golgotha. St. Paul writes,

"And you who once were alienated and hostile in mind because of evil deeds He has now reconciled in His fleshly body through His death, to present you holy, without blemish, and irreproachable before Him, provided that you persevere in the faith, firmly grounded, stable, and not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been preached to every creature under heaven, of which I, Paul, am a minister. Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the Church, of which I am a minister in accordance with God's stewardship given to me to bring to completion for you the word of God, the mystery hidden from ages and from generations past." (Colossians 1: 21-26a)

We can see this movement of offering our best gift at the altar. The priest offers "my sacrifice and yours" to God. And the people pray that the Lord may accept this sacrifice at the priest's hands, "for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church." Like St. Paul, the priest offers the Body of Christ, in the same way Christ offered Himself, to the Father for our salvation. Every Holy Mass we unite ourselves to the sacrifice which helps us grow in our relationship with God and each other. Like Simon, we help carry the cross. God's Peace!
