




At the Holy Mass, we are united at the altar of the Cross. As a reminder, Jesus offered Himself once and for all. He is the High Priest and the Lamb of Sacrifice offered on the altar of the Cross. "Not that he might offer himself repeatedly, as the high priest enters each year into the sanctuary with blood that is not his own." (Heb 9:25) At this particular moment of the Holy Mass we stand before this event, the Crucifixion. During the Stations of the Cross, a pilgrimage of the Cross, we genuflect and kneel at each station. We genuflect at the phrase: "We adore you O Christ and we praise you. Because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world" We kneel for a time of contemplation at every station recalling Jesus' love and sacrifice. We are humbled because of Jesus' humility as we recall from St. Paul to Philippi, "He humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross." (Phil 2:8) Imagine how you would react to

the crucifixion as a disciple of Jesus. When you saw Him upon that cross, what would be your affect? Would you stand, kneel, pass by? Would you laugh, cry, or become angry? What would you bring to the Cross of Jesus? This is the point of the Holy Mass when we get to do just that. You are able to bring to the Cross of Jesus all your burdens, joys, fears, hopes, sorrows, and pains. We look into the eyes of our Savior as we look to the Eucharist. God's Peace! Fr. 
Also, if you would like to bring some vegetarian soup (that includes the broth), salad (no bacon bits) or bread please bring some to share!


OLMC Prayer Shawl Ministry received a note of thanks and deep gratitude from Geisinger Northeast for the handmade crochet items distributed to their patients.
