

Third Sunday in Lent



We ended our reflection last week with Jesus' lament and how we comfort His longing heart. We are now entering into the most solemn part of the Holy Mass, the Eucharistic Prayer. However, before we consider this prayer of Jesus to the Father, we need to notice a change in the Liturgy. "The Lord be with You!" is a phrase used to awaken our spirit (and with your spirit) to move closer to God. It occurs in the beginning of the Holy Mass, in the greeting. It will also occur twice at the end of the Holy Sacrifice. In the beginning we are moving closer to God by entering into the community of faith. What are we moving closer to here? "Lift up your hearts" We are moving closer into the Sacred Heart of Jesus, uniting our hearts to His. So we lift our hearts to the Lord. This unity with Jesus fills us with thanksgiving to the Lord, our God. For it is "right and just". "To do justice and to love goodness and to walk humbly with your God." (Micah 6:8) We are humbled because only by uniting our hearts to Jesus can we walk with the Father. "Nothing unclean will enter [heaven], nor any[one] who does abominable things or tells lies. Only those whose names are written in the Lamb's book of life." (Rev 21:27) The entire Mass is a prayer to the Father through the Son. However, it becomes very apparent beginning here. The priest is now totally directing his address to the Father. We now kneel before the throne of God in

humility as the priest offers the Sacrifice. We kneel before

the Cross and Heaven itself! God's Peace!




Lenten Men's Retreat "Spiritual Direction: I'm Not Lost, I'm Wondering"



Soup, Salad and Study for the Soul




Also, if you would like to bring some vegetarian soup (that includes the broth), salad (no bacon bits) or bread please bring some to share!


