## Christmas Season The Epiphany of the Lord



Merry Little Christmas! Like the past two weekends, the weekend is no different. We celebrate two back to back solemnities, Epiphany of the Lord and the Baptism of the Lord. This marks the end of the Christmas Season in the current calendar. However, you can also continue the celebration until February 2nd, The Presentation of the Lord. This ended the Christmas Season in the old liturgical calendar. There are many traditions centered on the Visitation of the Magi. The first Christmas card one would receive with the Magi featured in the art would be displayed throughout the year on the door post. The blessing of homes with the inscription 20+C+M+B+24 would be placed on the door mantel throughout the year. "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" (Christ Blesses this House) or "Casper, Melchior and Balthasar" are the two meanings associated with this inscription. These traditions herald back to the Mezuzah which is used in Jewish households. It is placed on the door frame of the house and recalls two passages of Sacred Scripture, Deuteronomy 6:4-9 and 11:13-21. It also recalls the Passover Sacrifice of the blood of the

lamb on the doorposts. Thus, this simple gesture reminds us along with all who visit our house several things. That no matter where our journey takes us we have a home in God. That God alone is Lord of our home and family and we serve no other gods. That we teach our children and are open to sharing our faith with others. The Christ, the paschal lamb, is claimed and claims us in our Baptism. And that God's peace is always welcome and presented to all. God's Peace, Fr. Brian




